A linocut (or lino print, linoleum block print) is a type of relief print where you carve into a block of linoleum and take a print from the inked surface of the block. (the process of making a linocut print) How do I transfer my drawing or image to the linoleum block? I usually first trace my image onto tracing paper.

One of my favorite lino cut techniques is the reduction print method, when you use the same linoleum block to print multiple colors. It sort of requires a whole different mindset when making a print so I've broken down all the steps of the reduction print process and teach an online class focusing on this technique.

For blocks 5 x 7 or smaller, apply spray glue to the back of a sheet of sandpaper and mount on a known flat surface, such as a glass inking slab. Place the linoleum block face down and move the block in small circles until the surface is uniformly sanded to a soft flat finish of even tone.

Finally, coat your block with a layer of ink and press paper or fabric over it to make a print. To learn how to block print with a sponge, scroll down!

Start by sketching a design on a block, and carve out the surrounding surface. Then, roll ink or paint onto the block with a brayer. To print it onto paper, press the paper onto the block, and rub it with a baren to ensure even distribution.

Roll the ink onto the print block and then put the paper on top of the block. Use the back of a spoon or a second roller to press the paper onto the block (this is called “burnishing”). Here is a great video that covers the basics of how to ink and print. Linoleum Block Printing - YouTube.

Linocut, also known as lino print, lino printing or linoleum art, is a printmaking technique, a variant of woodcut in which a sheet of linoleum is used for a relief surface. A design is cut into the linoleum surface with a sharp knife, V-shaped chisel or gouge, with the raised areas representing a reversal of the parts to show printed. The linoleum sheet is inked with a roller, and then impressed onto paper or fabric. The actual printing can be done by hand or with a printing press.

That means you'll use the lower-right corner of your original print as a "pivot" and print a new block to the right of the first. Then rotate the lino block clockwise again, pivoting around the same corner, and add a new square below that one. Finish up with another pivot and a final square on the bottom left.

Linocut Classes | Boarding All Rows

Use a range of tools. If you can, get a few different tools: V-gouges, U-gouges, large and small. Use all the tools you have, each will make a different kind of mark. For example, a V-gouge will make a very fine line if you use just the tip. If you carve deeper it will make a wider line.
